**2019 Association Meeting Report**

On behalf of Central Baptist College and President Terry Kimbrow, thank you for your financial support of the ministry of Central Baptist College! When you send an offering to CBC, whether monthly, quarterly, or by special offering, you are making a difference in lives of our students—you are contributing to the “transformation of lives.”

CBC offers something a public institution cannot—an education that integrates Christian faith and academic excellence. Higher education institutions that practice faith integration in the classroom hold the belief that all truth comes from God. This worldview sees God as the source of truth for all disciplines, be it mathematics, science, history, or any other subject. Therefore, the student receives a deeper, more thorough education when the professor is not limited by mandates prohibiting discussions of faith.

We are seeing God’s movement on the CBC campus in the early part of the fall semester. For example, during a Core Values meeting for new students 2 weeks ago, there were 8 new students who indicated a commitment to follow Christ. Student leaders counseled with them and are now personally disciplining them. They and other students have been connected to area BMA of AR churches, so they can have the opportunity to follow in believer’s baptism and to grow as new believers. **The new discipleship ministry** is a student-led program facilitated through Director of Church Relations, Duffy Guyton. Students, faculty and staff are involved in personally disciplining students.

**The college’s Special Emphasis “CBC Day” will kick off on September 15, 2019.** CBC Day contributions will be for the CBC Annual Fund that supports, among many other things, the ministry grant, academic and performance scholarships, spiritual life programs, and the development of new academic programs.
